As far back as I can remember my family has used the little table prayer printed above as preparation. I remember my mother and father teaching us that as we prayed we were inviting God Himself to come and dine with us as our guest. We were also taught to recognize that the very items placed before us were God's gifts to us as we asked Him to bless them for our good and His glory. It was only after the proper preparation of prayer that we would enjoy our meals together.

As we come nearer and nearer to the season of our Lord's birth it is fitting that we prepare at this time also. Advent is the season of such preparation. Over the weeks of Advent we will make ready for the coming of our Savior.Just as the little table prayer above assisted us in making us ready to enjoy a meal together, so also it will serve to assist us in our preparation for the celebration of our Lord's birth.

We begin by simply focusing upon the promise of God that He is coming soon. As we pray this part of the prayer, we acknowledge that He is faithful to His promises and we eagerly expect His coming soon.

We continue through Advent by recognizing that God comes as both Host and Guest. He comes to host the victory celebration and the final marriage feast. He also comes as guest for He arrives to dwell among and within us. Are we ready for His arrival?

As we near the festive season we will focus upon the blessings which accompany our Lord's arrival. He is the Word made flesh and dwells among us in bodily form. The gifts of Word and Sacrament which He provides are truly life-giving gifts, imparting faith and salvation to all.

These gifts brought by our Savior are His gifts. They are intended, however, for you and for me. They are a rich blessing to each of us as God works through His means of Grace to restore the relationship that once was lost.

Ultimately, we conclude with a final affirmation. We close this prayer with the Amen from God's people. Amen, yes, it shall be so shows our confidence in God's loving care and His provision for us. We proclaim a bold and final AMEN as we acknowledge God's manifold love and blessings to us.

Repenting of "Yours" and "Mine"

Retailers have had their Christmas displays up since before Reformation Sunday. The kids have made their list and checked it twice, or three times or more. It won't be long before the tree will start shedding its needles, the stockings emptied, the gifts unwrapped, toys broken, and the too small or out of style clothes returned. Before we know it, the annual celebration of Christmas will be over.

But for the children of God, we know that the gift of Christmas doesn't ever end. Week in and week out, the Lord continues to shower His gifts on us. Every time the Lord gathers us to His house, and we are led to kneel at His table, the gift of forgiveness is repeatedly granted to us. It is nothing we deserve. It comes to us freely!

The fourth stanza of the stewardship hymn, "Forgive Us Lord for Shallow Thankfulness" (LSB 788) highlights both this gift and our response.

Teach us, O Lord, true thankfulness divine, that gives as Christ gave, never counting cost.



I will Praise Him Every Season Psalm 166:2

To learn thankfulness is necessary. The parents of young children are well-versed in the fact that they must teach their children thankfulness. It does not come naturally. The spiritual genetics inherited from our parents allow us to think that the world revolves around us. When we receive something, there is an inward desire to think that we in some way deserve it.

But there is no way that we deserve anything we get from our Lord. We need that ongoing lesson from God Himself. Thankfulness toward God is worked in us by the Holy Spirit. God's Word works this thanksgiving in us. We need this weekly reminder that Jesus didn't consider "equality with God a thing to be grasped, but emptied Himself" for us, to the point of death on a cross (Phil. 2:6). He didn't bat an eye. He paid the price! Our life of stewardship is one of daily and weekly thanksgiving inspired by the Lord Himself. That knows no barrier of "yours" and "mine," assured that only what's withheld is lost.

Because Jesus gave us everything and more, there can be no ownership. The child at Christmas is quick to claim that the newly gifted toy is "mine!" But as Psalm 24:1 asserts, "The earth is the Lord's and the fullness thereof, the world and those who dwell therein." There isn't anything in creation that is ours. When we cling to and claim ownership of anything in creation, we are losing out on the continual gifts with which the Lord desires to shower upon us. Closed hands cannot receive anything new. We cling to the old and dead and miss the new thing that the Lord desires to do in and for us.

We are led to repent of the "yours" and "mine" and remove the lie that we have any ownership. In this we have the promise that God will continue to give to us. Not just at Christmas, but every Sunday at the altar in the Lord's house.



Rise & Shine

As a result of God's redeeming work through the Messiah, the light of life would fall on Israel. God's people would then turn to shine forth as a spiritual light to all nations. We are to do likewise, reflect the light of God's Messiah to the nations so that we are instrumental in removing the spiritual darkness that covers our world!
